

Building description

The Courthouse opened in 1936. Today it houses the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit and the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York. It contains 23 courtrooms and 45 judicial chambers. When the building was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1986, all the exterior and interior public spaces were given landmark status.

Scope of work

- Inspected and documented the condition of the terra cotta roof and lantern, granite tower, and surrounding brick elevations of the plinth.
- The first project completed with TPAS (Tablet PC Annotation System), the deliverables included both paper and electronic elevations and associated digital photographs.
