# Scope of work

- Close visual examination and hammer-sounding of limestone cladding at exterior of buildings.
- Documentation and quantification of fault conditions using TPAS™—a direct digital annotation system.
- Comparison of findings from current survey to previous survey data.

### **Problems solved**

- Completed comprehensive close visual examination of end wall with minimal impact on building occupants and public.
- Compared findings from current survey to previous survey data using digital documentation.

# **Building description**

The State Museum of Pennsylvania and Pennsylvania State Archives are part of the Pennsylvania State Capitol Complex in downtown Harrisburg, PA. The five-story Museum is circular in plan, with 32 facets around the exterior. Each facet is comprised of four-story high "panels" of Indiana limestone units between the recessed limestone masonry at the column lines. The 22-story Archives building is a windowless rectangular slab, also clad in Indiana limestone panels.
